Children at the Evening Study Centres learned about waste segregation, composting, water and energy conservation, plastic reduction, and tree plantation under the theme "One Earth, One Future." Women from East Namachevayapuram planted trees and distributed saplings at Nungambakkam Railway Station Park, Chennai, promoting environmental protection and cleanliness. 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INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

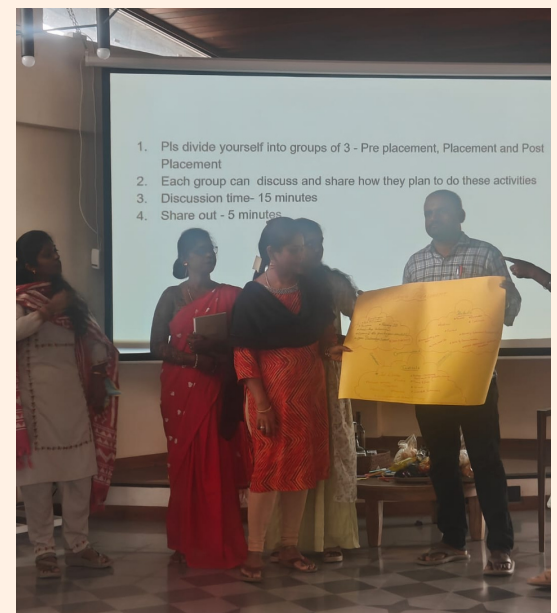

NAVIGATOR TRAINING OF TRAINERS QUEST ALLIANCE AT BANGALORE

Mrs. Jyothi Priya and Mrs. Ashmi represented ARUWYE at the Navigator Training of Trainers (ToT) organised by Quest Alliance in Bengaluru from 15 June 2026 to 19 June 2026. The five-day residential programme strengthened their capacity to deliver learner-centred employability training through experiential learning approaches. The training covered key areas such as rapport building, learner psychology, learner mobilization strategies, facilitation techniques, curriculum planning using the MyQuest platform, meaningful transition, career readiness and the integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Green Curriculum into training delivery.

The facilitators also gained practical exposure through classroom observation at SAFA Foundation, case study analysis, collaborative group activities, reflective discussions, and teach-back sessions that enhanced their facilitation and communication skills. The programme provided valuable insights into learner engagement, employer verification, market scanning and sustainable practices, equipping the facilitators to strengthen programme delivery and enhance learner outcomes at ARUWYE.



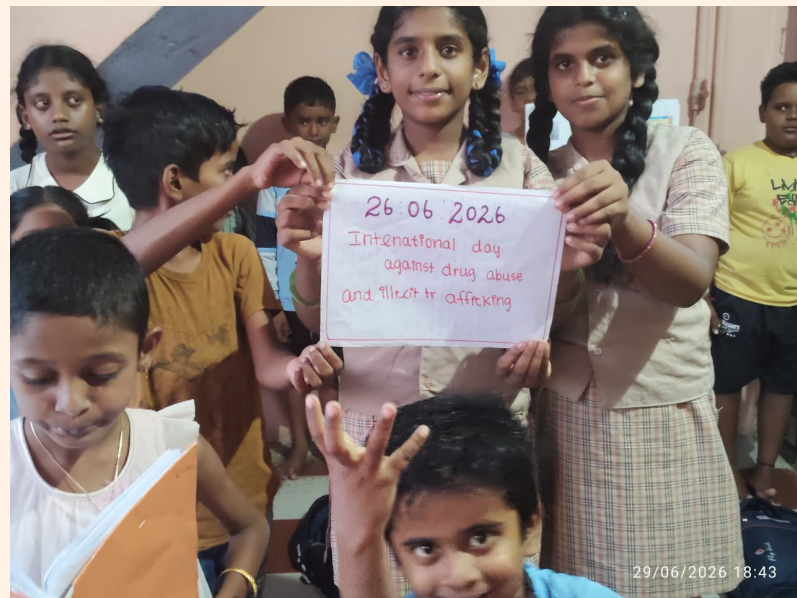
ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS CONDUCTED IN AYANAVARAM AND KORUKKUPETTAI



On 26 June 2026, Anti-Human Trafficking (AHT) awareness initiatives were successfully conducted in Ayanavaram and Korukkupettai to strengthen community awareness and promote child protection. At Ayanavaram, a Community Awareness Program brought together residents to understand the realities of human trafficking, its prevention, and the importance of safeguarding children and other vulnerable individuals. Participants were provided with an AHT Mini Booklet containing essential information, preventive measures, and important helpline numbers. The session encouraged community members to remain vigilant, report suspicious activities and actively contribute to creating a safe, trafficking-free environment. On the same day, an AHT Street Play Training was organised for the already established Children Ambassador Group in Korukkupettai, with enthusiastic participation from 30 children. The training equipped the young ambassadors with knowledge on human trafficking, child protection, and effective community awareness strategies through creative street play performances. By strengthening their communication and advocacy skills, the program empowered the children to become peer educators and change-makers, enabling them to spread awareness, educate their communities and play an active role in preventing human trafficking.

DRUG-FREE TODAY, HEALTHY TOMORROW

On 26th June 2026, ARUWYE Evening Study Centers conducted a Drug Abuse Awareness Session to educate children about the harmful effects of drugs and substance abuse on individuals, families, and society. Children actively shared their observations about drug abuse in their communities and learned how addiction affects physical health, mental well-being, education, and family life. Teachers encouraged students to spread awareness among their parents, relatives, and neighbours about leading a drug-free and healthy lifestyle. The session inspired children to become responsible citizens and promote safe, healthy, and child-friendly communities.

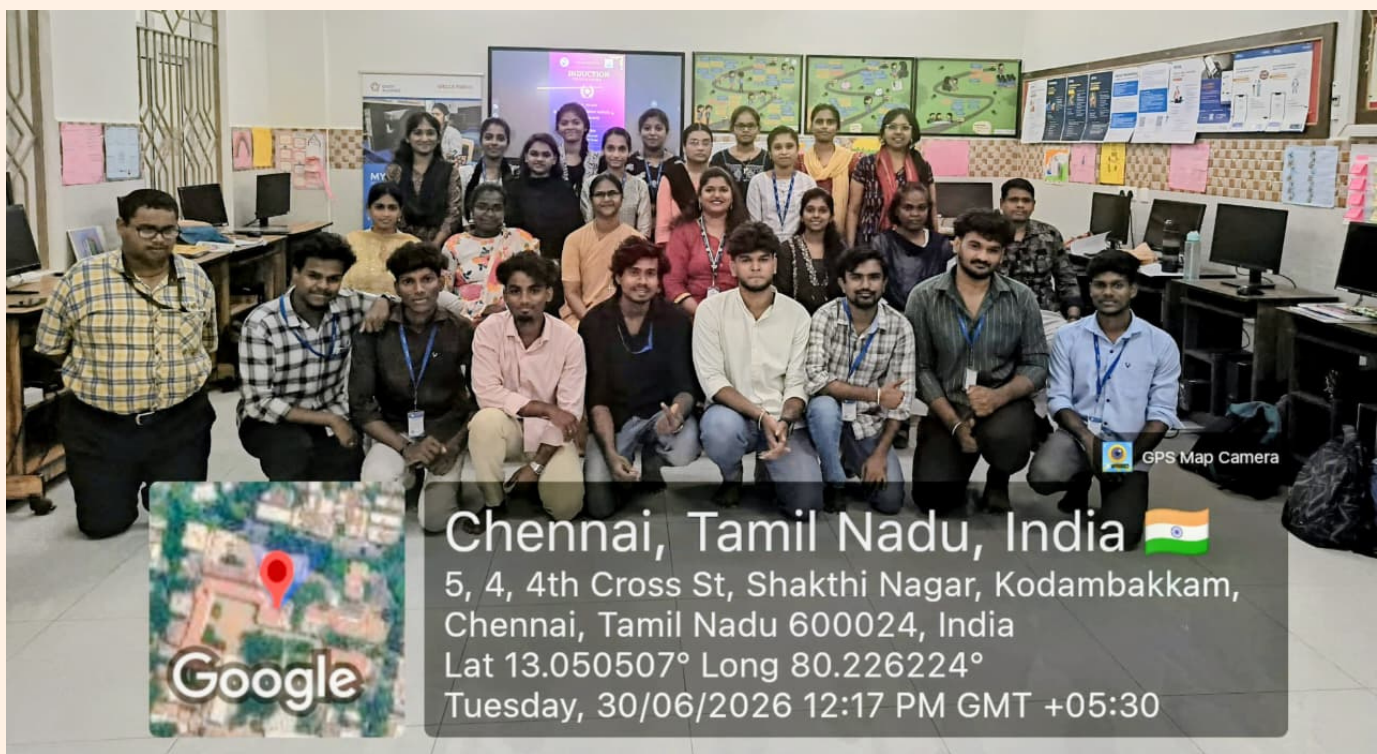


ONLINE HACKATHON FOR QUEST LEARNERS
