State Level Children Parliament Training Programmes – INM Province

ARUWYE organized two State-Level Children Parliament Training Programmes on 8 May 2026 at the INM Province, with active participation from ANCP students across Michaelpuram, Thiruvannamalai, Salem, Erode, and Vellore districts. The programmes focused on promoting democratic values, child rights, leadership, environmental responsibility, and active citizenship. Students learned about the structure of ANCP, the Indian Government, and key social issues through interactive sessions facilitated by Mr. Paul Thomas. Children were assigned parliamentary roles such as Prime Minister and Ministers, enabling practical learning of governance and leadership. Awareness rallies were conducted on environmental protection, peace, child rights, and social responsibility. Students actively carried placards and slogans, spreading awareness among the public. A special session on identifying community issues and drafting petitions empowered children to address local concerns such as sanitation, water scarcity, and environmental challenges. Creative activities on Child Rights and the 3Rs—Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle—encouraged expression and critical thinking. The programmes successfully strengthened leadership, teamwork, confidence, and civic awareness among the participants, motivating them to become responsible and active citizens.



Women Tailoring Training Programme and Certificate Distribution Ceremony

On 25th May 2026, the Tailoring Training Program for women participants was successfully conducted, empowering women through vocational skill development and livelihood opportunities. The training covered Normal Chudi Drafting and Stitching, Normal Blouse Drafting and Stitching, with active participation from all trainees who showed great enthusiasm and dedication in both theoretical and practical sessions. Despite some participants' family responsibilities and school holidays, we arranged additional support and revision classes to help them complete the syllabus. The program significantly improved the women's tailoring skills, self-confidence, and motivation towards self-employment and financial independence. A Certificate Distribution Ceremony was held on 26.05.2026 in the presence of AHT (Anti-Human Trafficking) Project Manager Sr. Pauline, Chief Guest Sr. Louia, and Project Coordinator Sr. Isabella, during which certificates were distributed to all 20 participants. An exhibition showcasing tailoring works such as Petticoats, Frocks, Umbrella Frocks, Chudithars, Blouses, and other practice materials reflected the participants' creativity and practical learning achievements. The women expressed gratitude for the opportunity while also highlighting the need for proper sewing machine maintenance to improve future training sessions. Overall, the program created a positive impact by strengthening women's skills, confidence, and economic empowerment, encouraging them towards self-reliance and a dignified livelihood.
